<p>seam (noun)</p>	<p>A seam is a line of stitches which joins two pieces of cloth together.</p>	<p>Cross Curricular Links: Art</p>
<p>wadding (noun)</p>	<p>any soft material for use in padding, packing, stuffing, etc.</p>	<p>Printing - William Morris and Andrea Lauren (aesthetics)</p>
<p>backstitch (noun/verb)</p>	<p>a strong sewing stitch made by starting the next stitch at the middle or beginning of the preceding one</p>	
<p>assemble (verb)</p>	<p>To assemble something means to fit the different parts of it together.</p>	<p>Outcome:</p>
<p>hem (noun)</p>	<p>A hem on something such as a piece of clothing is an edge that is folded over and stitched down to prevent threads coming loose.</p>	
<p>decorate (verb)</p>	<p>If you decorate something, you make it more attractive by adding things to it.</p>
